**NOTICE OF EXTENDED COMMENT PERIOD:**  
**RESIDENTIAL CODE PROPOSALS**  
**2011 REACH CODE ADOPTION**

*The division is extending the period for proposing residential code amendments to the International Green Construction Code, relating to the development of Oregon's first Reach Code*

**Extended Comment Deadline: February 22, 2011 by 5:00 p.m. – Comments on the proposed code MUST be submitted by this deadline.**

**Proposal Process:**

On December 9, 2010, the Building Codes Division opened the process to accept residential code proposals for possible inclusion into the Oregon Reach Code. During this open comment period, the division received requests to extend the comment period for this rulemaking. As a result of these requests, the division has granted an extension of the comment period for an additional 29 days.

The division will use the 2012 International Green Construction Code Version 2.0 as the model document for the code. The division is requesting code amendment proposals for sections of the 2012 IGCC that relate to energy efficient buildings. Proposals must include a brief explanation of the connection between the proposal and energy. Energy efficiency is defined in the charging legislation as "the use of construction and design standards, construction methods, products, equipment and devices to increase efficient use of, and reduce consumption of, electricity, natural gas and fossil fuels in buildings."

The division may consider provisions peripherally related to energy efficiency as appendices that could be adopted by local jurisdictions. Chapters 4, 5, 9, and 11 are outside the scope of BCD's authority and will not be considered for inclusion in the code. Sections 704-710 fall outside the scope of energy efficiency. The division may address these provisions through the plumbing code adoption process. Sections 804-807 also fall outside the scope of energy efficiency.

The division will utilize the public proposals submitted by the extended deadline of February 22<sup>nd</sup> and discussions from a code committee to develop the Oregon Reach Code to present to the appropriate advisory board or boards by April 2011, for an anticipated code adoption date of July 1, 2011.

All comments must be received in the division's office no later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, February 22, 2011. Written comments may be submitted to the contacts listed below.
