Introductions

Chapter 7 Water Efficiency and Conservation

Ms. Teverbaugh explained the language in Chapter 7 to the committee. The intent is to utilize the provisions from the IAPMO Green Plumbing supplement in order to maintain compatibility between the codes.

Chapter 8 Indoor Environmental Quality and Comfort

Ms. Teverbaugh explained the language in Chapter 8 to the committee. For items that were not tied to energy efficiency staff has recommended striking the contents but retaining the section number for future consideration. Many of the provisions dealing with indoor air quality are best practices but do not impact energy efficiency.

Motion to approve as modified Chapter 8.

Chapter 9 Commissioning, Operation and Maintenance

Ms. Teverbaugh suggested the chapter be tabled until the next meeting so the sections on commissioning could be discussed with corresponding sections tabled in Chapter 3. She asked the committee to review those sections and become familiar with the language before their discussion.
