

1 **WHAT THE LAW SAYS**

2 (1) Under ORS 479.620(1), a person may not engage in the business of making
3 electrical installations, advertise as or otherwise purport to be licensed to make
4 electrical installations or purport to be acting as a business that makes electrical
installations without an electrical contractor's license. ¹

5 (2) Under ORS 479.550(1), no person shall work on any new electrical installation
6 for which a permit has not been issued.

7 **ORDER**

8 Under ORS 455.895(1)(a) and OAR 918-001-0036, the Board assesses the
9 following sanction:

- 10 (1) a \$3,000 civil penalty for violating ORS 479.620(1)
11 (2) a \$1,000 civil penalty for violating ORS 479.550(1)

12 The civil penalties assessed total \$4,000.

13 **STIPULATED AGREEMENT**

14 Respondent and the Board agrees to resolve this matter without a hearing
15 according to the following terms:

16 (1) Respondent admits to committing the violations as alleged in the Findings of
17 Fact and Conclusions of Law and agrees the Board will issue an order imposing the
18 proposed civil penalties for such violations in order to resolve this matter.

19 (2) The Board agrees to suspend \$2,750 of the \$4,000 in civil penalties for a
20 period of five years under the following terms:

- 21 (a) Respondent agrees not to commit further violations of Building Codes
22 Division's statutes and/or rules.
- 23 (b) Respondent agrees to pay the remaining \$1,250 of the civil penalties or
24 *\$1,000 if full payment is submitted by the due date on the invoice that is
included with your copy of the Order signed by the Board. The additional
\$250 will then be added to the suspended amount.*
- 25 (c) If Respondent fails to make a payment within the time period stated on
the Final Demand, collection of the entire civil penalties, including any
suspended amount will be initiated.

¹ For purposes of ORS 447.040, 479.620, 480.630 and any other license regulated by ORS chapter 455, "engaging in the business" means to advertise or solicit, contract or agree to perform, or to perform, work for which a license or permit is required under Oregon law, including but not limited to a single instance.
